CLUB EBONY

Club Ebony, one of the South's most important African American nightclubs, was built just after the end of World War II by Indianola entrepreneur Johnny Jones (1907-1950). Under Jones and successive owners, the club showcased Ray Charles, Count Basie, B. B. Bobby Bland, Little Milton, Albert King, Willie Clayton, and many other legendary. When Johnny Jones died, his son, Johnny Shepard, inherited the club. In 1971, Shepard sold the club to the Mississippi Blues Commission, which purchased the club for \$100,000.
