Goal of the Program

Launched in 2011, the goal of the Ambassadors program is to provide Delta area youth with the opportunity to become actively involved with the Museum and help carry out its outreach mission. The hope is that through this program the Museum will develop long-term partnerships with local schools, enabling students to participate in a series of training experiences and intern opportunities that will help them develop into lifelong learners, productive citizens and community leaders.

In January, the B.B. Kina Ambassadors toured the Mississippi Delta on a search for the history of the Missippi Blues. Eleven (11) Ambassadors visited 20 sites and markers that were a part of the Missippi Commission's Blues Blues Trail. The Blues Trail markers provided a unique opportunity for the Ambassadors to explore the people and places that impacted the Blues. The Ambassadors received valuable historical information from Mr. Robert Terrell, Director

of Operations for the B.B. King Museum, about world-renowned Club Ebony, located on Hanna Street in Indianola, its famous visitors and past owners.

Act of Giving Back



The B.B. King Ambassadors participated in a service project for Samaritan's Purse called Operation Christmas Child. According to Franklin Graham, President of Samaritan's Purse, the collected shoeboxes are delivered to needy children around the world. "Each box is an opportunity for a boy or girl to experience the love of God in a tangible way and hear the Gospel," states Graham. The Ambassadors and their parents were excited to participate in this project, and contributed fifteen (15) boxes for the needy children. The boxes were hand-delivered to First Baptist Church in Indianola, a local drop-off site, on Thursday, November 15th by Sherby Hale, the program's coordinator.

Ambassadors Graduation



The B.B. Bridge Building Youth Leadership Program held its graduation program on Saturday, May 25, 2019, in the Cotton Gin at the Museum. Eleven Ambassadors participated

in graduation. Over 50 parents and guests were in attendance. The graduates offered scripture, prayer, a welcome, program overview, and class poem. The message from former 2014-15 Ambassador, Aysia Jones, was outstanding. Aysia is currently a sophomore at Tougaloo College in Jackson, Mississppi. The graduates received certificates and gift bags. Two Ambassadors received a Perfect Attendance Award and two received the Community Service Award. One outstanding student received a \$100 scholarship. After a brief reception, the Ambassadors took their parents on a tour of the museum's exhibits.

Community Projects



In April, 2019, Ambassadors completed a community service project at Nelson Dotson Park located on Hannah Street. They were greeted by Mayor Steven Rosenthal and his wife, Robin at the park. Mayor Rosenthal informed the Ambassadors about the history of Nelson Dotson and his activism despite having a disability. A total of 12 ambassadors picked up limbs and trash, planted flowers and cut the grass. Even though, the activity was strenuous, the Ambassadors challenged themselves and learned about the importance of giving back to others.



The Ambassadors held their final community service project on Saturday, May 11th, at Delta Missions, Inc. Delta Missions is a faithbased organization, founded by Reverend Herron Wilson, which offers weekly Bible study to youth, adults and senior citizens, and sponsors Vacation Bible School in several communities in the Delta. On Saturday, nine (9) Ambassadors helped nearly 40 kids to create Mother's Day cards. They also painted faces and worked in the kitchen to prepare Saturday's meal.
