Sunday, March 3rd, Ambassadors traveled to Jackson, MS, to visit and tour the Two Mississippi Museums: Museum of MS History and MS Civil Rights Museum. The Ambassadors were met and given a personal tour from the former and youngest Freedom Rider, Mr. Hezekiah Walker.
